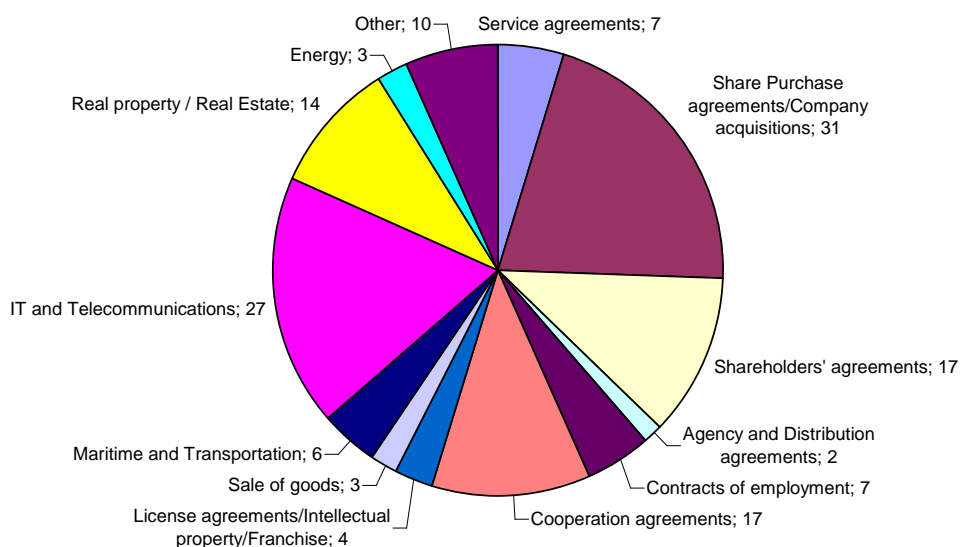


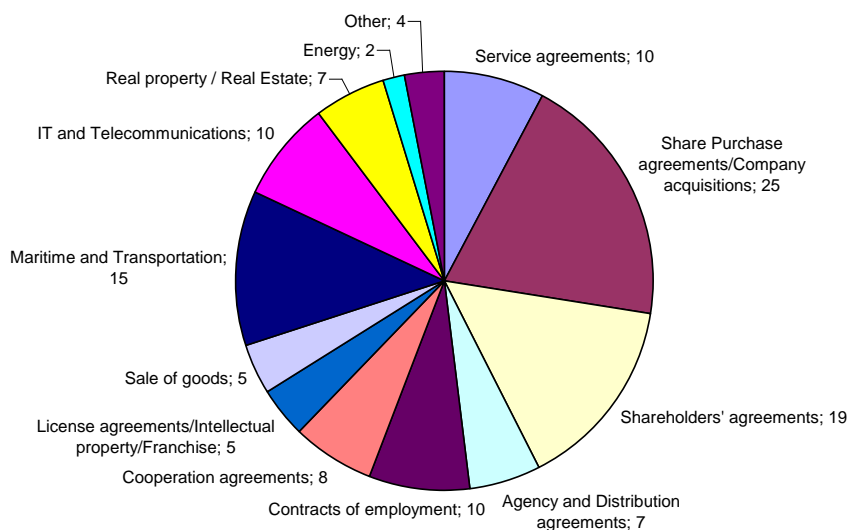
Statistical Report for 2009

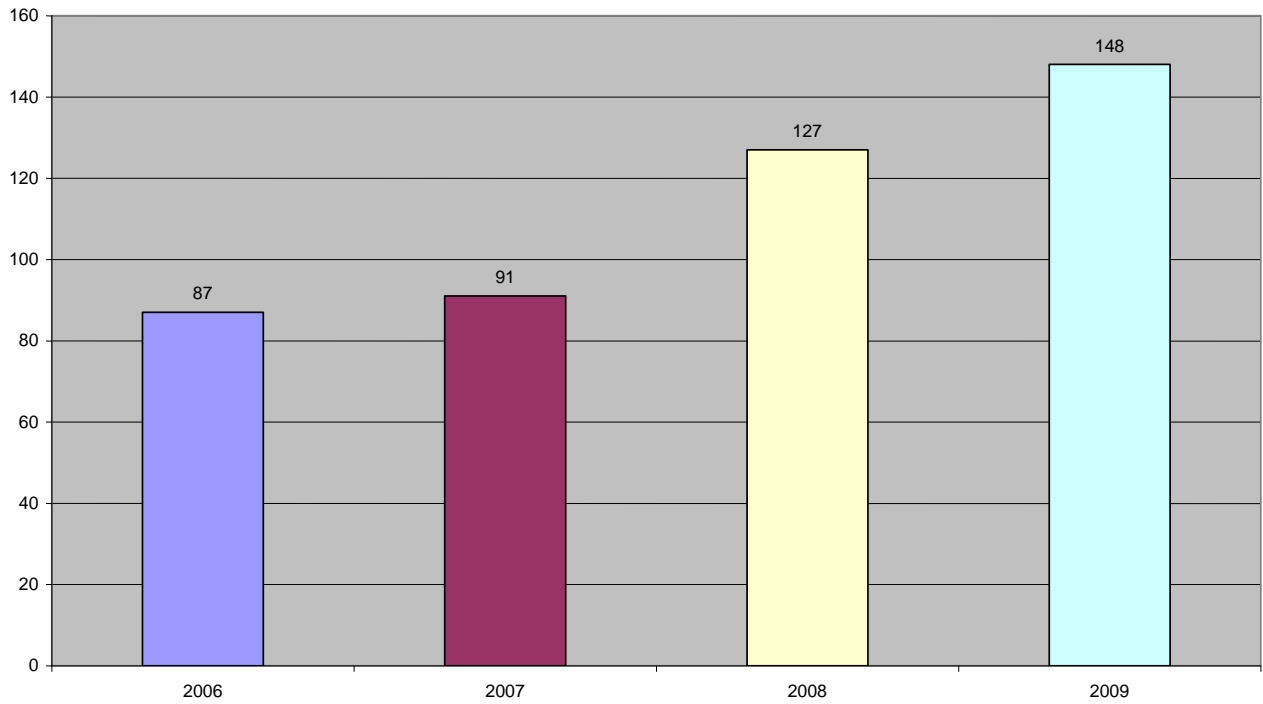
Cases divided by subject - 2009



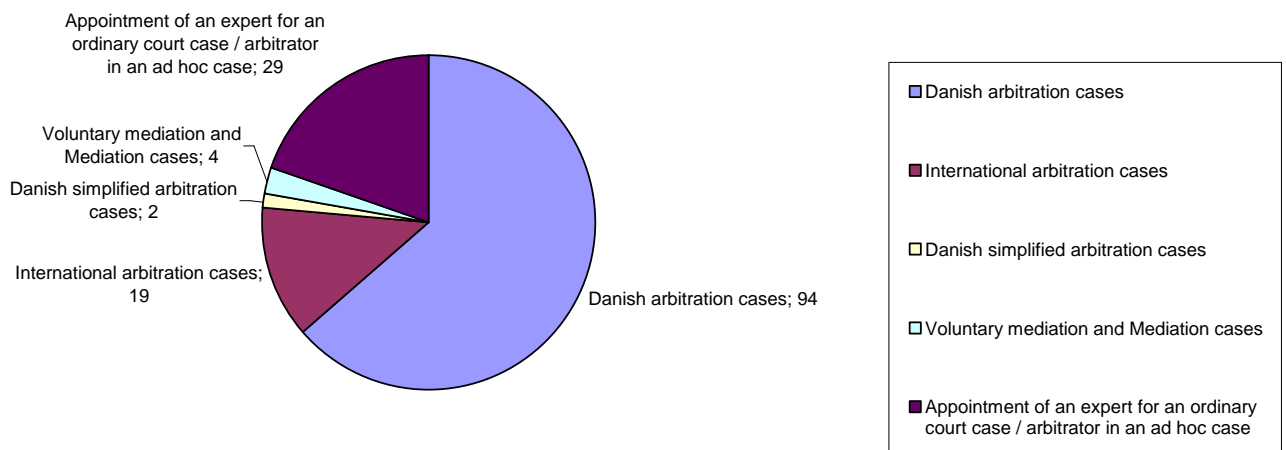
Cases divided by subject - 2008



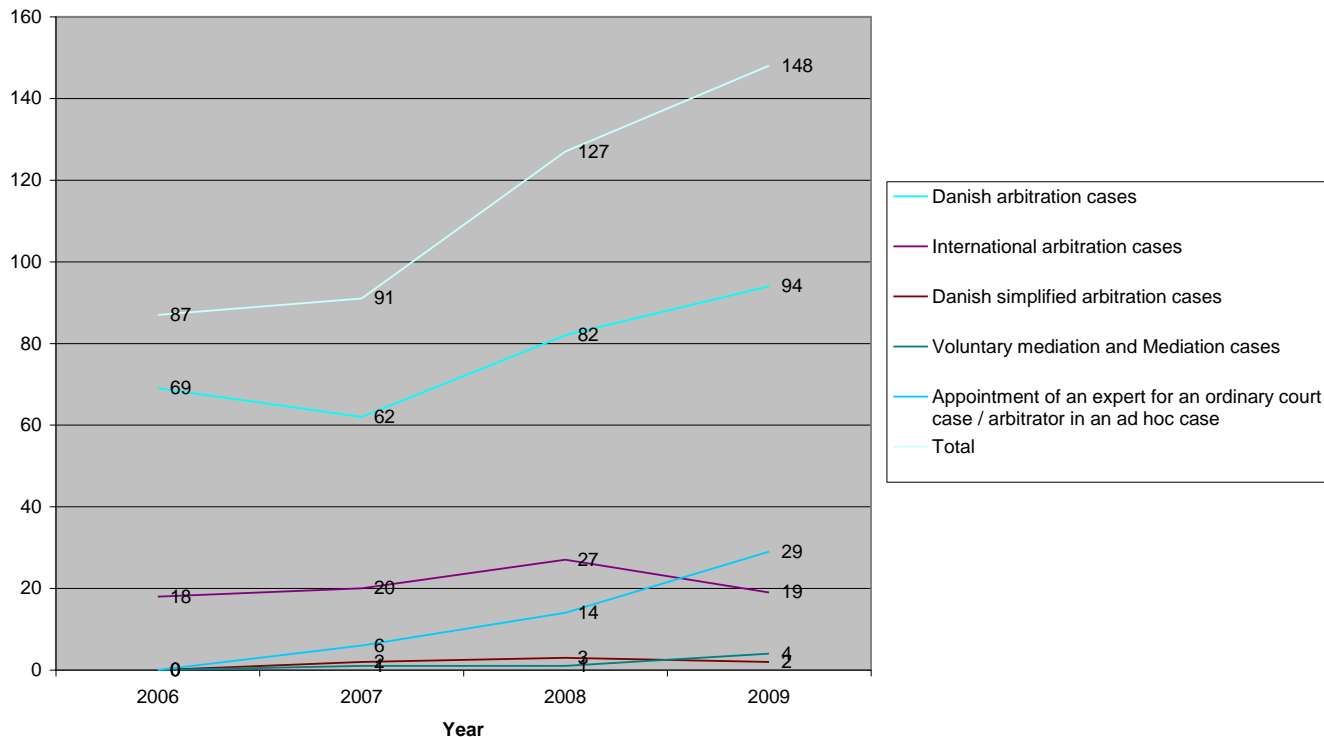
Number of cases received from 2006-2009



Cases received in 2009 - distributed by type



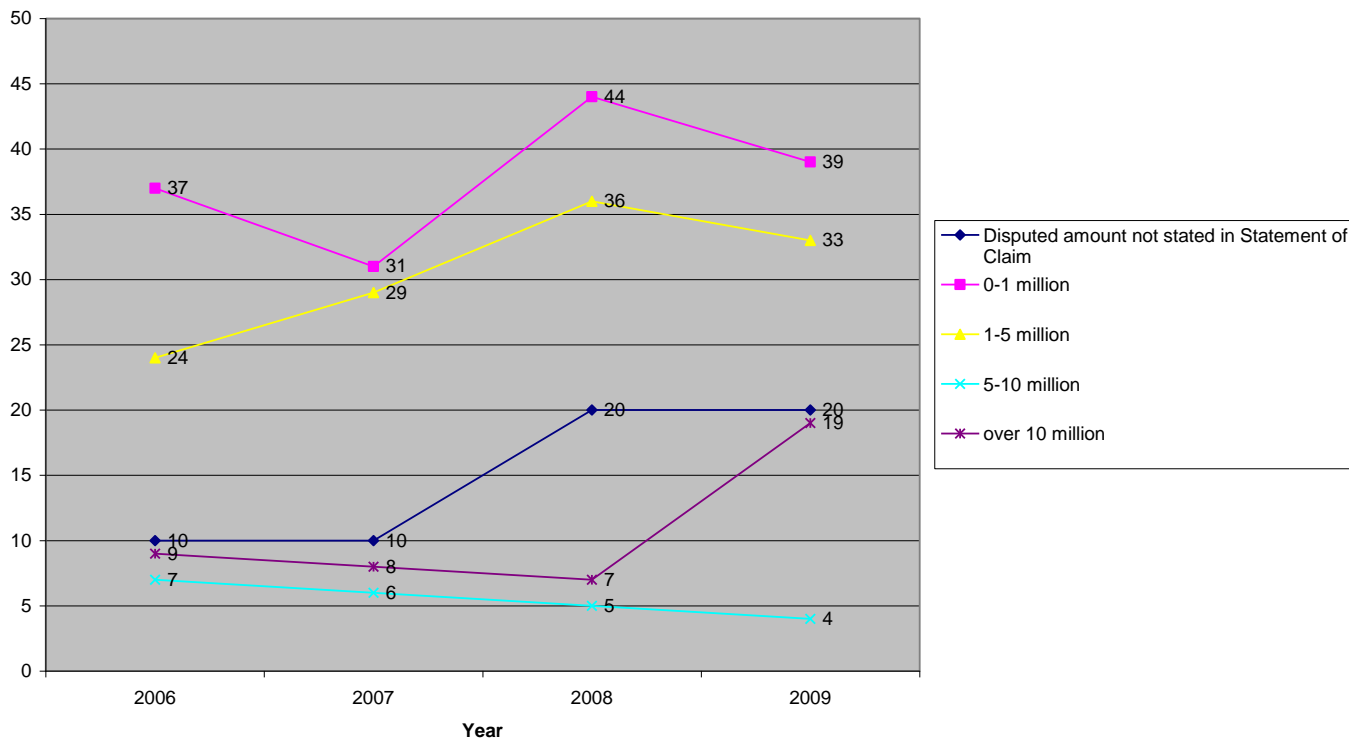

Arbitral Awards and Advisory Opinions

In 2009, 39 arbitral awards were rendered, 9 of which were awards in international arbitration cases. Eleven advisory opinions were rendered in 2009, 2 of which were in international arbitration cases. The average time for handling these cases was 14 months for domestic cases and 19 months for international cases.

In 2008, 51 arbitral awards and advisory opinions were rendered, 8 of which were in international arbitration cases. The average time for handling these cases was 11 months for domestic cases and 16½ months for international cases.
