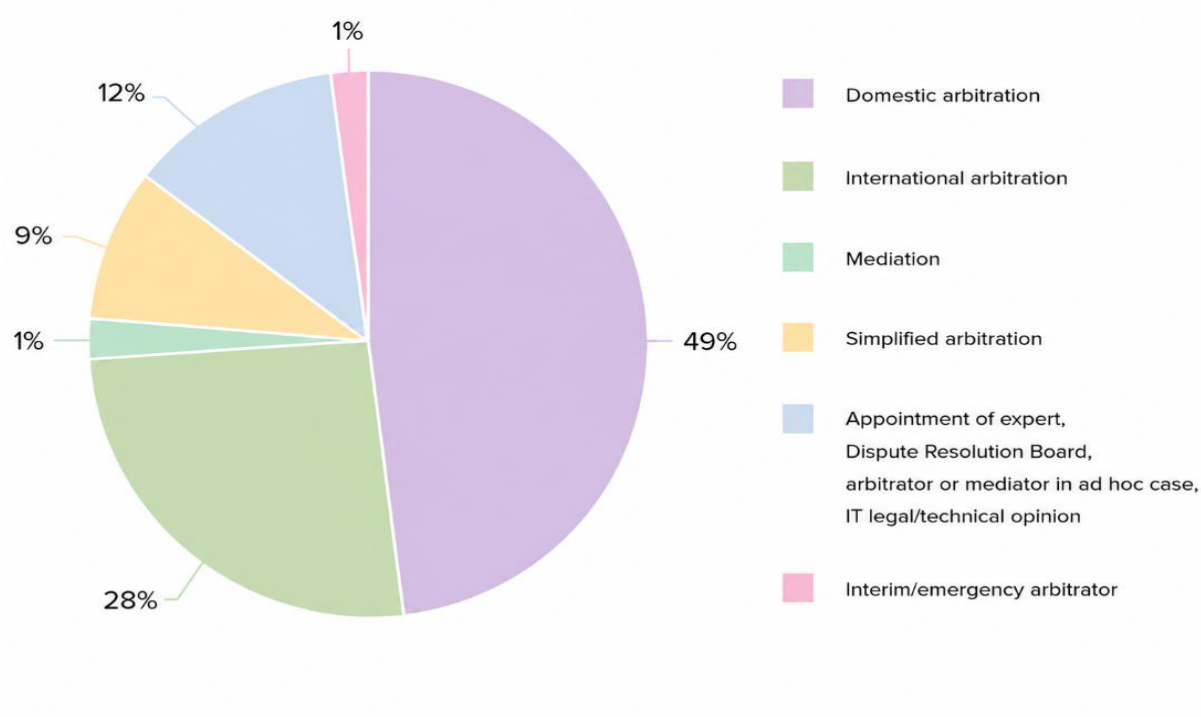
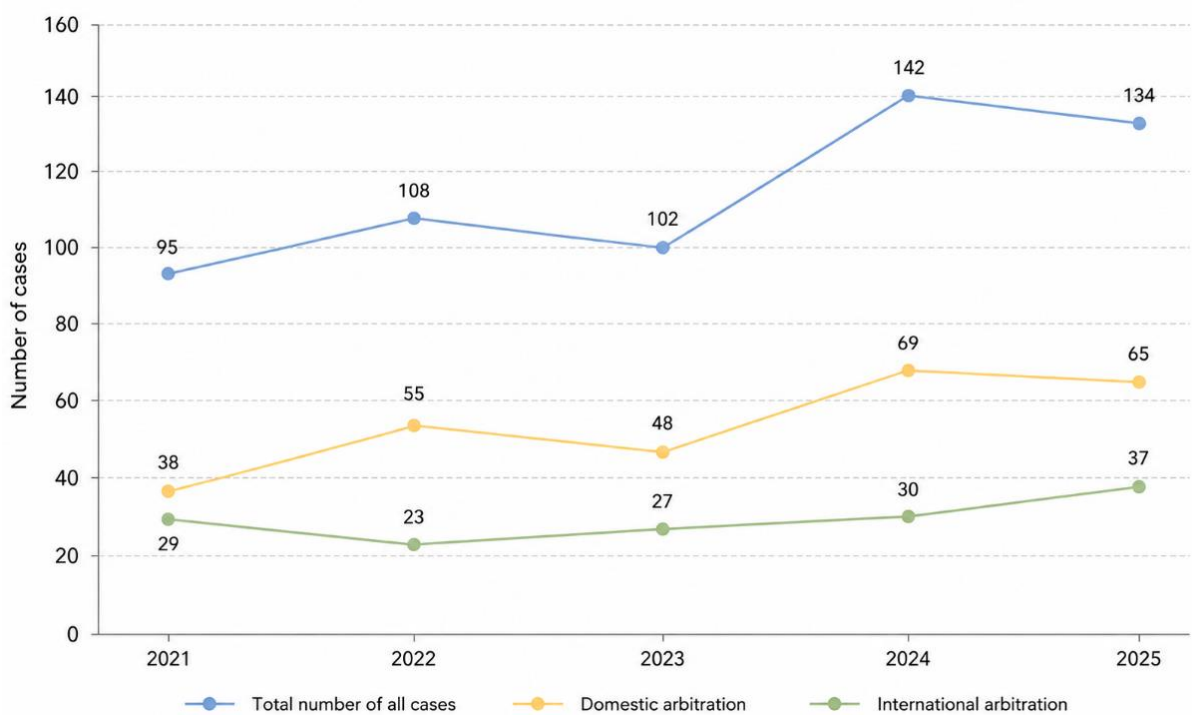


An average of 116 cases per year have been filed at the Danish Institute of Arbitration (DIA) in the past five years.

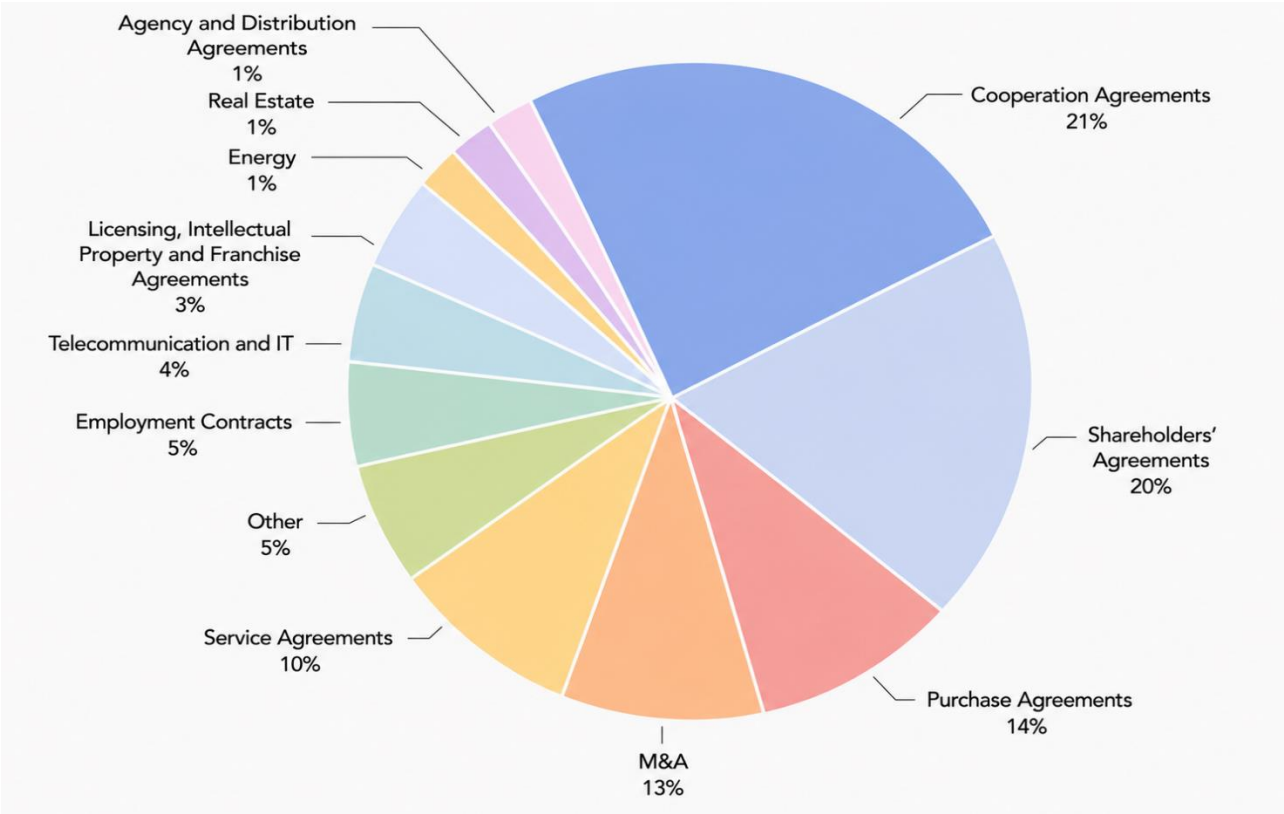
Types of cases filed in 2025



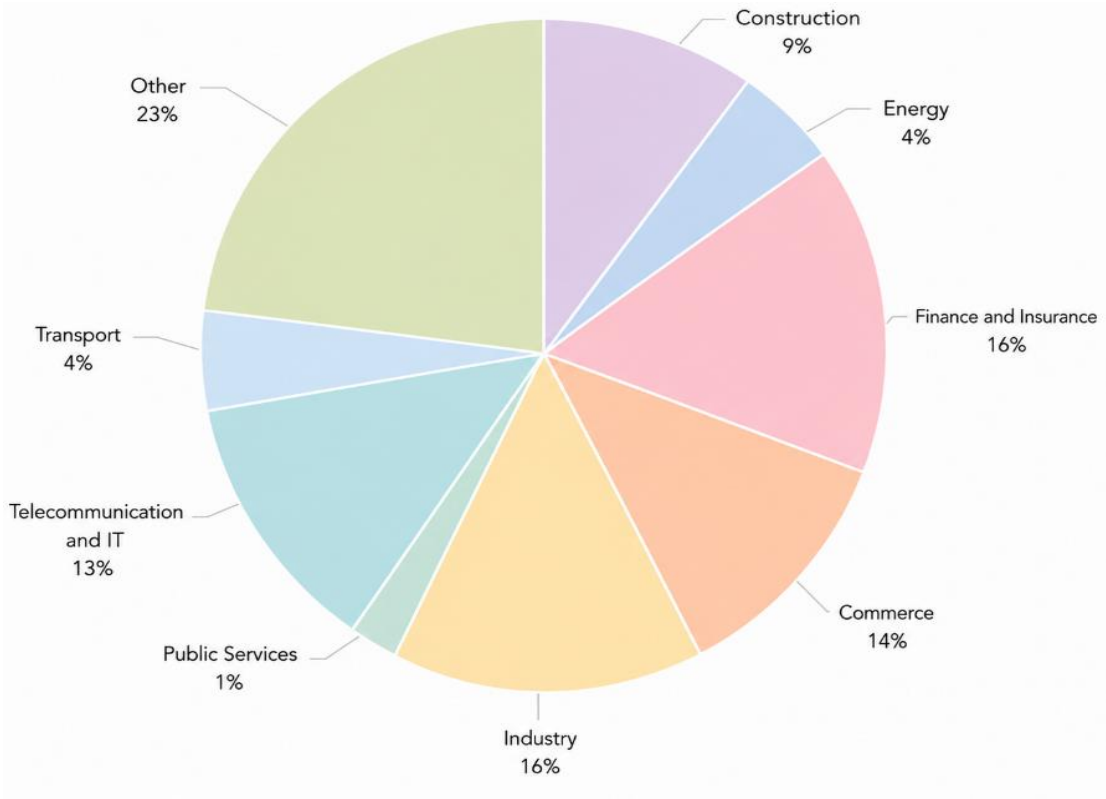
DIA's caseload for the past five years



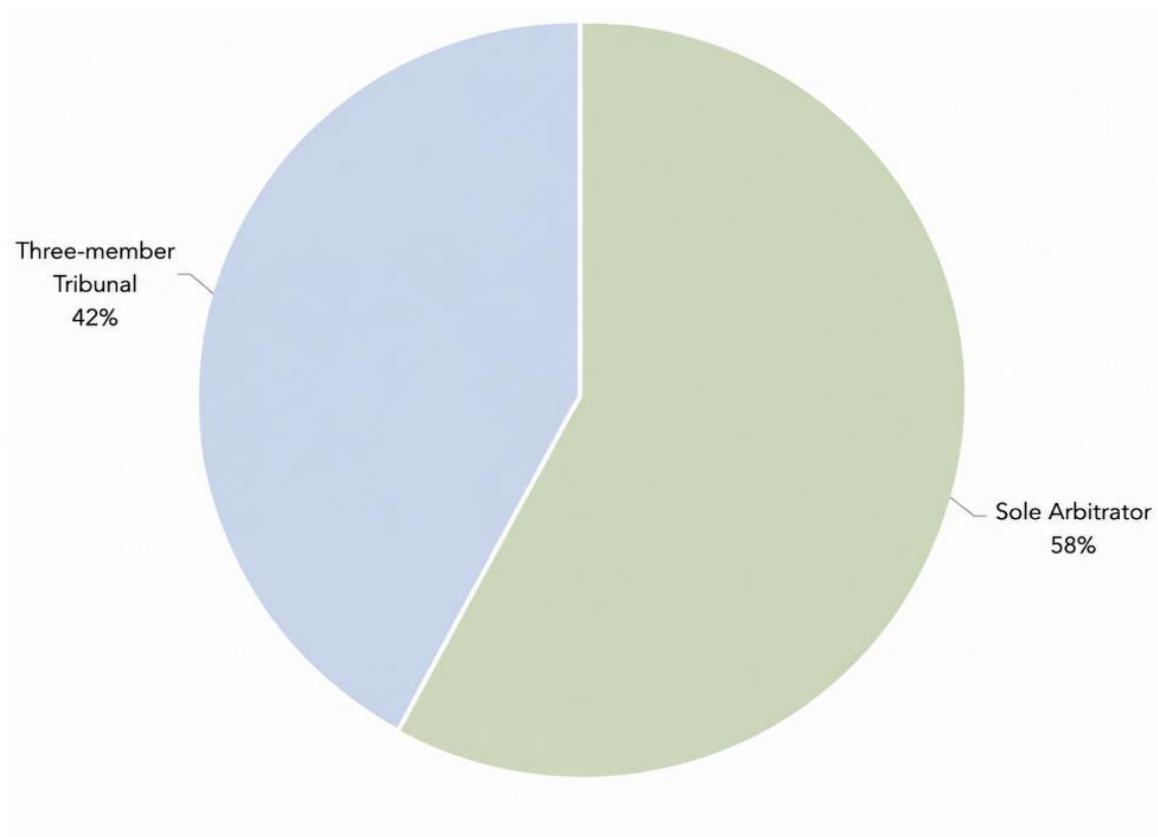
Subject-matters of the disputes filed in 2025



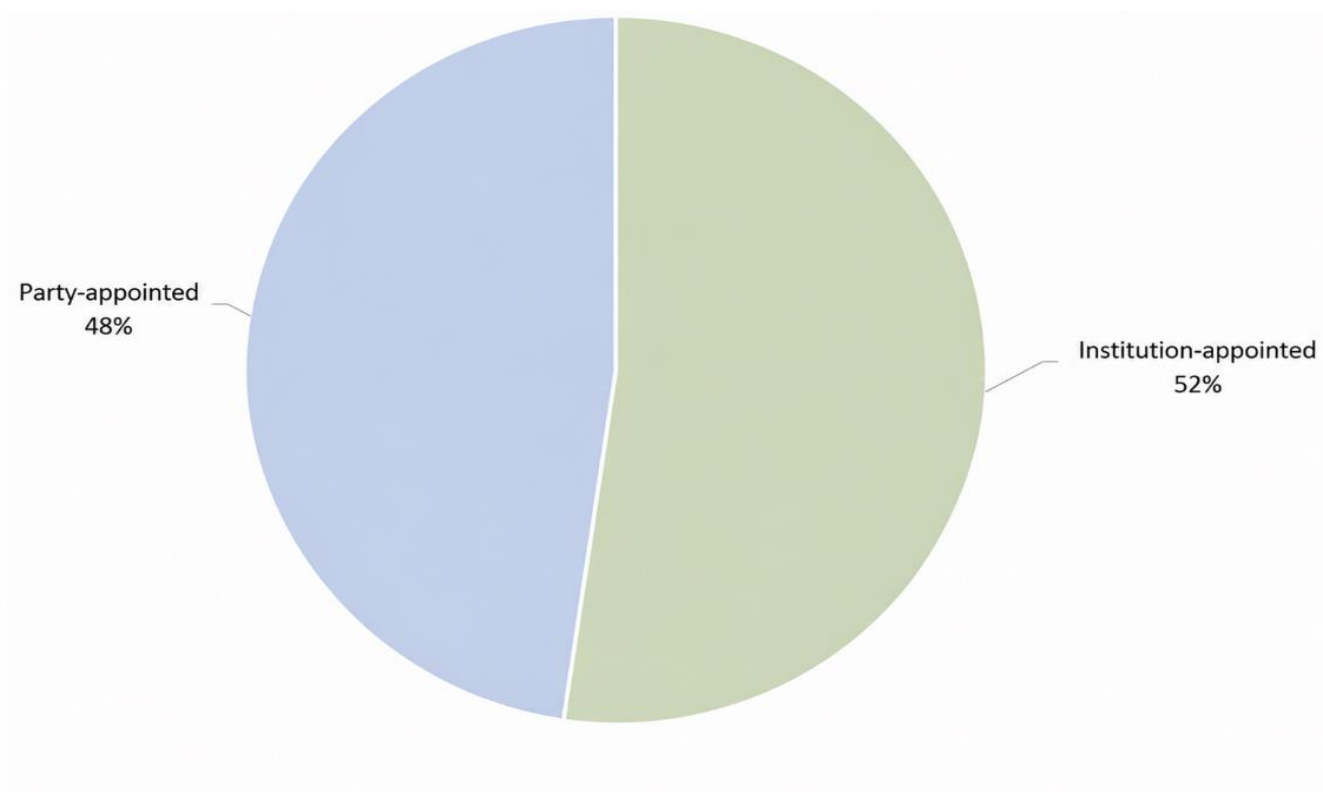
Sectors of the disputes filed in 2025



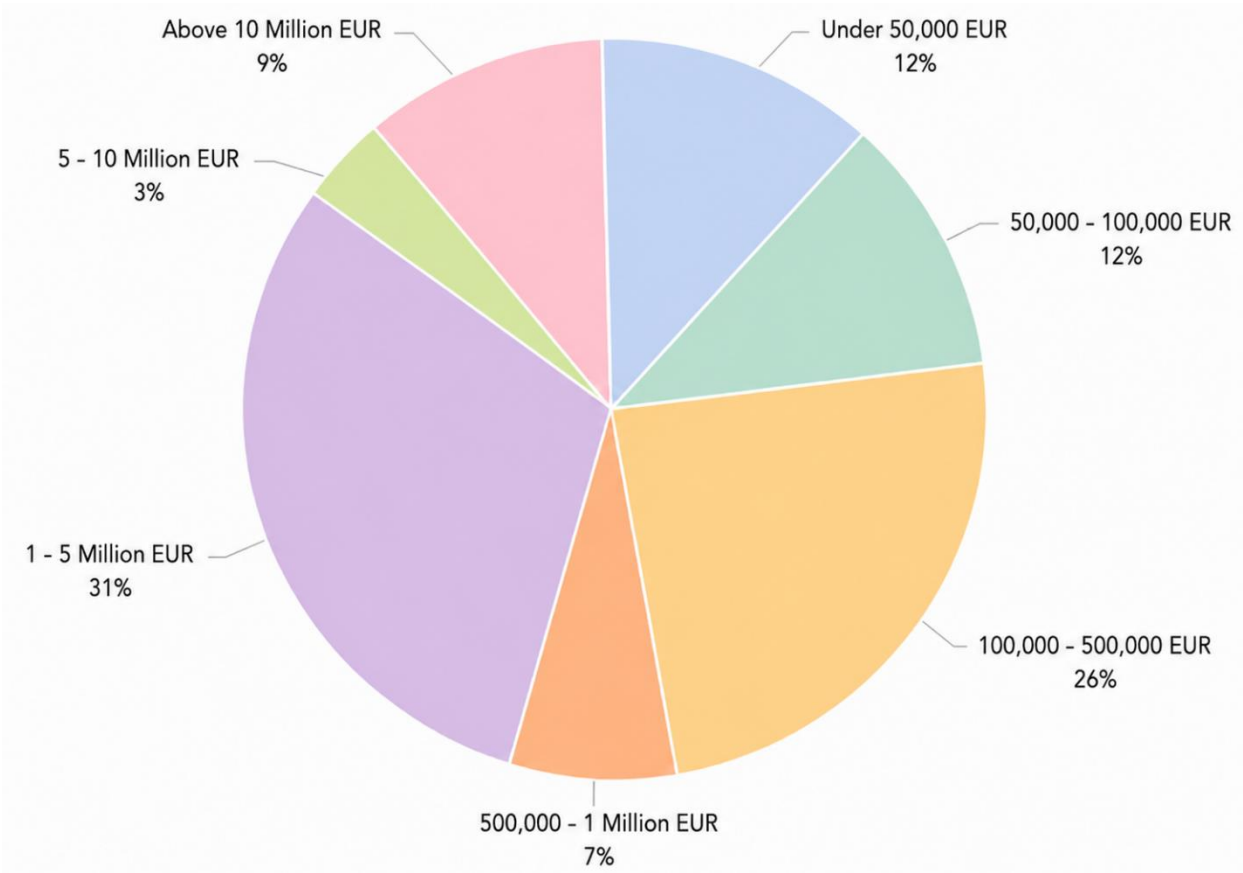
Sole Arbitrators and Three-member Tribunals in 2025



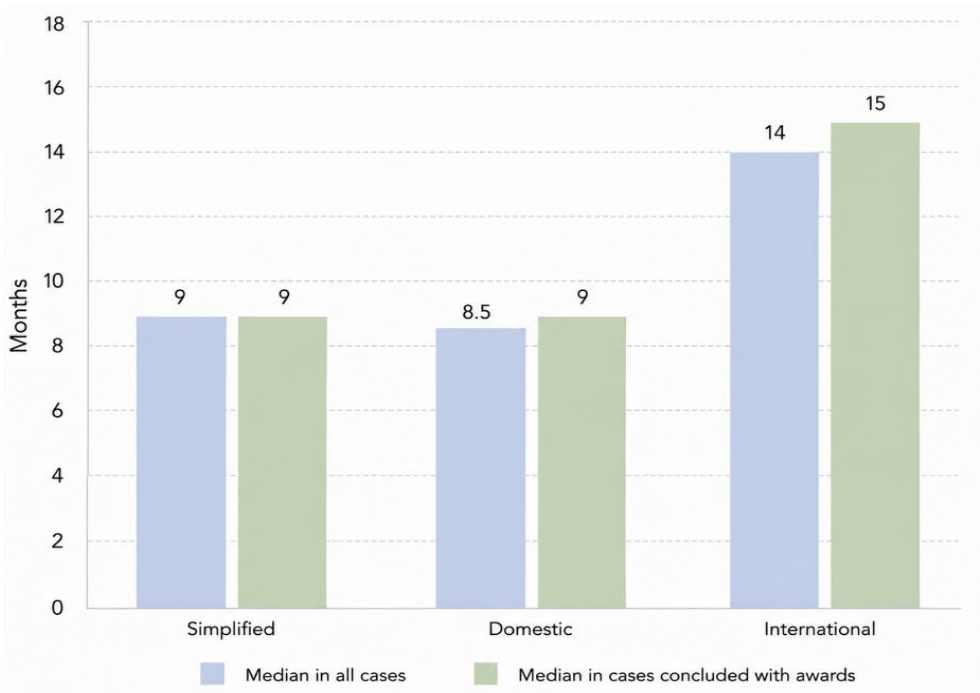
Party-appointed and Institution-appointed arbitrators in 2025

Nationality of the Parties

In the cases filed in 2025, the parties came from 24 different nationalities (including Denmark).

Final Awards Rendered

In 2025, a total of 62 final awards on the merits were rendered.

Gender Diversity

In 2025, 27% of all arbitrator appointments at the DIA were female.

Out of the arbitrators appointed by the parties (including by co-arbitrators), 13% were female.

Out of the arbitrators appointed by the DIA, 39% were female.

Out of all the appointed three-member tribunals, 29% had a female chair.
